


Activities during Anti-Poverty Week 2019 that focused on Newstart – increasing understanding and taking action collectively

(see also Media Summary 2019 APW).



Getting the message out that increasing Newstart is the most effective solution to reducing poverty in Australia

- ✓ Anti-Poverty Week publishes Poverty and Newstart Fast Fact, July 2019.
- ✓ Two national research reports released: Foodbank's 2019 Hunger Report on Sunday 13th
 October and Anglicare Australia's 2019 Jobs Availability Snapshot on Wednesday 16th (both with State/Territory data break downs and recommendations including Raise the Rate of Newstart.)
- ✓ One major State poverty research report was released: 'Mapping Economic Disadvantage in NSW' report undertaken by NCOSS in conjunction with the National Centre for Social and Economic Modelling (NATSEM). Includes interactive maps and recommendation to raise the rate of Newstart as a solution to poverty and disadvantage in NSW.

Reaching out to Influencers and Decision-Makers – action by APW secretariat

- ✓ Submission #25 to Senate Inquiry into Adequacy of Newstart, 13 September.
- ✓ Toni Wren, ED Anti-Poverty Week met with **Greens Senator** Siewert, 17 September.
- ✓ Email letter from APW Co Chairs to all **Federal MPs and Senators**, 27 September, including link to all Fast Facts and "In 2019 we are encouraging our network to support the Raise the Rate campaign to increase unemployment payments as part of our focus on promoting solutions to poverty in Australia." >80% open rate.
- ✓ NSW APW Briefing to **NSW MPs** including Premier, Deputy Premier and ALP MPs Penny Sharpe, Marjorie O-Neill and Greens MP David Shoebridge, 9 October.
- ✓ APW Briefing emailed to all Federal MPs and Senators, including message from Co Chairs, list of events, copy of all Fast Facts and thank you to sponsors, 11 October. >80% open rate.
- ✓ Toni Wren, "A \$65 increase in Newstart is both right and smart", <u>SMH print (online 14/10)</u> plus The Age, Brisbane Times, 15 October.
- ✓ Toni Wren, ED Anti-Poverty Week met with Liberal MPs Russell Broadbent and Bridget Archer and ALP Shadow Social Services Minister Linda Burney MP plus adviser to Leader of the Opposition during APW – all meetings included focus on need to increase Newstart as well as different aspects of poverty.

Taking action collectively to end poverty

NGOs take action to increase Newstart

Overall the focus was very positively received: "We liked the call to action this year. Focused call to actions are great."

✓ St Vincent de Paul Canberra/Goulburn hosted a Raise the Rate breakfast for CEOs who had taken part in their Canberra CEO Sleepout to brief them on the Newstart campaign. Speakers included ACOSS CEO Dr Cassandra Goldie and a Canberra resident with lived experience as well as Stephen Byron, Managing Director, Canberra Airport

- ✓ <u>Many Voices 1 Message Raise the Rate</u> on Thursday 17th hosted by The Neighbourhood Hub, Mackay, QLD included sausage sizzle, info and support.
- ✓ Mission Australia, CEO blog APW and Newstart 14/10/19 plus CEO spoke at A Future Without Poverty for Young People event, Sydney 14/10/19 plus multiple regional events in NSW and some Staff Letters to the Editor published in The Northern Star Lismore, Braidwood Times, Yass Tribune and The Goulburn Post in NSW; the Hobart Mercury in Tasmania and the Gold Coast Bulletin in Queensland.
- ✓ **Uniting Vic/Tas** had a team running in the Melbourne Marathon with a focus on ending poverty plus advocacy on Raise the Rate.
- ✓ Release of Northern Territory Poverty Statement 16/10/19 by NTCOSS, Jesuit Social Services, St Vincent de Paul Society and Central Aboriginal Land Council which called for an increase to Newstart.
- ✓ Perth Anti-Poverty Network held a Raise the Rate rally including a speaker from the Australian Unemployed Workers' Union.
- ✓ Port Phillip Community Group, Victoria Raise the Rate community event including lunch, speakers and activities.
- ✓ Poverty in the Shadows A series of stories from the real lives of the many women who face poverty and homelessness (including difficulty living on Newstart) displayed in Newcastle and Wallsend Public Libraries during Anti-Poverty Week.

✓ Shepparton Family Care, VIC hosted a <u>community sausage sizzle</u> on Thursday 17th but only served half a sausage to acknowledge the inadequacy of Newstart payments and need to Raise the Rate.



- ✓ Uniting Vic.Tas, "It's time to raise the rate this Anti-Poverty Week" media release 11/10/19. Also urged people to write to their MP or share their Newstart story with link to Raise the Rate.
- ✓ Newstart Nannas protest outside Federal Parliament House.



Politicians take action to increase Newstart

✓ Numerous Motions to increase Newstart passed in the Senate during APW.




- ✓ Federal Shadow Ministers release video on poverty on Facebook,16 October.
- ✓ Linda Burney MP Shadow Minister for Social Services Matter of Public Importance in the House of Representatives 17 October, 9 Federal MPs from 2 political parties.
- ✓ Senate debate on poverty on 17 October, 6 Senators from 3 political parties.
- ✓ Alicia Payne MP, Federal Member for Canberra, makes video including need to raise the rate.
- ✓ Local Federal MP Sharon Claydon speaks at the <u>Poverty in the Hunter, We all know someone worse off</u> rally in Newcastle, 18 October.
- ✓ 18/10/19 QLD Deputy Premier supports increasing Newstart at APW Raise the Rate event—first time Queensland Government has publicly supported Raise the Rate.
- ✓ NSW Deputy Premier announces Federal Government should reconsider opposition to increasing Newstart on 24 October at NCOSS Anti-Poverty Week event NCOSS Putting regional needs on the map, Sydney 24 October.
- ✓ 8 November, Tasmanian Premier comes out in support of Newstart increase.

6000 people in the ACT are receiving Newstart



Reserve Bank Governor,
Phillip Lowe, suggests
that an increase would be

"good for economy"



55% of the people on Newstart live under the poverty line.



There is just **ONE** job available for every eight people looking for paid work or more hours.



\$282pW including the energy supplement.
A single unemployed person needs \$434pw to cover the cost of basics.



A \$75pW increase to allowances would lift the ACT economy by 31m in the first year alone according to Deloitte Access Economics.



For **25 years**,
Newstart has not been increased in real terms, while living costs for people on low incomes have gone through the roof.



12,000 new jobs added and \$3.3 billion worth of extra spending by consumers would be a result of raising the rate according to Deloitte Access Economics.



Of **69,000** rental properties surveyed by Anglicare Australia, just two properties Australia-wide were affordable for a single person receiving Newstart.



There are increasing numbers of people on Newstart with disabilities and over 55 years old — the majority of long-term unemployed are now mature-age job seekers.



A decade ago the OECD warned that Newstart was low enough to raise "issues about its effectiveness in providing sufficient support for those experiencing a job loss, or enabling someone to look for a suitable job".
