

Anti-Poverty Week 2020 Media Coverage - Summary Highlights @30/10/20

In 2020 we counted ~160 separate media items during APW itself, published in ~360 online articles and heard over ~ 280 TV or radio outlets. We also had significant coverage between the end of May and August ahead of APW (13 items in total) in addition to an Australia at Home webinar and CEDA podcast.

Anti-Poverty Week facilitated a special <u>Australia at Home</u> focused on poverty on 25/5/20. The <u>webinar</u> featured Bruce Bradbury, lead researcher for <u>the ACOSS/UNSW Poverty and Inequality partnership</u>, Jacqui Phillips, Deputy CEO of ACOSS, Toni Wren, Executive Director of <u>Anti-Poverty Week</u>, and Freya Pollard, a university student with lived experience. "*My mental health has never been as bad as when I am on welfare payments and living in poverty*." Over 240 people joined live and were able to ask questions through the chat.
