A single parent with 2 children was paying \$300/week rent in June, but receiving only \$73/week in Commonwealth Rent Assistance.

The Coronavirus Supplement was helping fill the gap, but the \$150/week cut will bite hard into household budgets and risk poverty and homelessness.
